The Postgraduate Certificate in Deaf Education Studies (Early Years) is a post-qualification pathway targeted at teachers of the deaf, audiologists and other practitioners who work or are intending to work with very young children and babies who are deaf and their families.

This course is unique in the United Kingdom. All modules are offered as stand-alone 30 credit modules. Students may undertake individual modules or complete a certificate (2 modules).

POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN DEAF EDUCATION STUDIES (EARLY YEARS)

Students have regular face-to-face contact with teaching staff at the residential study weekends. Each module has a designated study weekend in which there are taught sessions, group seminars and opportunity for individual tutorial support. All students are encouraged to make contact by email with module leaders and the course leader for support and guidance as required and contact details of staff are available to all students.

The Developing Deaf Infant (0-2 years)	30 credits
Early Audiological Management	30 credits

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- A degree or equivalent professional qualification and continuing CRB/DBS clearance.
- All applicants must have two references including one from their current employer. The current employer must be prepared to support their employee as a postgraduate student by providing study leave and funding as appropriate.
