Beauty Therapy: Level 2 & 3

Where can it take you?

The Level 2 certificate is a wonderful qualification for those without a formal qualification and those who would like to progress to the Level 3 diploma and a career in beauty.

The Level 2 certificate offers the opportunity to develop your skills. It is split up into modules that range from health and safety to manicures and makeup. It will develop and nurture your skills in the management of skin conditions, waxing, eyebrow treatments and eyelash treatments.

What will the course cover?

L2 - Introduction to the Beauty Sector, Health and Safety, Skin Care, Basic Manicure and Pedicure, Eyebrows and Eyelash treatments, waxing & Nail Art. This is a one-year introductory Beauty course where students begin by working on each other and progress to working with paying clients when they reach a suitable level of competency. Optional workshops are put on throughout the year to extend skills and experience.

L3- This course extends on skills developed in L2. The course covers body massage, electrical face and body treatments, firming and toning, individual eyelash extensions and permanent hair removal.

In February, the salon becomes a working environment where members of the public can have a variety of treatments and students are assessed by the tutor undertaking the treatments to a high standard with all health and safety issues closely monitored. By the end of June students will have completed all summative assessments competently and will achieve their Level 2/3 Beauty Therapy Qualification.



<u>How will the course be</u> organized?

- L2- Starts in September and usually takes a year.
- L3- Starts in September and usually takes a year.

Are there any other costs and what do I need to bring?

You will be required to wear smart clothing on the course and will be provided with a tunic to wear on the course. Smart, flat shoes are essential.

A good understanding of personal hygiene is essential. Think about working in close proximity with others.
